

[Dynamic DunesCAPES](#) is a partnership project that has been working to restore sand dunes across England and Wales for the benefit of wildlife, people, and communities. Between 2019 and 2023 the project has been working on the conservation of sand dunes at 11 locations across North and South Wales. This has included conservation activities to rejuvenate dune habitats and a huge range of work with schools and local groups, volunteers and visitors of all ages and abilities to help rejuvenate our dunes and allow the threatened wildlife to flourish. Below is a summary of the resources produced during the project's lifetime which will support individuals and organisations close to sand dunes in Wales to learn, explore and help along the Welsh coast.
