

[Dynamic Dunescapes](#) is a partnership project that has been working to restore sand dunes across England and Wales for the benefit of wildlife, people, and communities. Between 2019 and 2023 the project has supported the delivery of conservation action and has been working with communities at 11 locations across North and South Wales.
